Since its founding in 2002, with support from Elsie Hillman, The Sprout Fund and Councilman Bill Peduto, the NPC has provided opportunities for its membership to leverage their resources for regional gain. Our events and mailing list are open to anyone who is interested, but we maintain a particular connection with NPC delegates – our main points of contact at each member organization.

HUB (host. unify. blend.)

Our quarterly HUB events are co-presented by two or more member orgs, bringing young professionals together to make connections, build partnerships, learn about and support our region, and have a great time doing it. The co-presenters choose the topic and content, and each HUB is different!

- **For the Greater Good: Young Professional Service Opportunities (April '10)**
Hosts: Big Brothers Big Sisters, GLENDA, Urban League Young Professionals
The first HUB in 2010 was all about discovering rewarding service opportunities and organizations ripe for young professional involvement. We met at the new Fate Lounge to exchange ideas, learn about the presenting organizations, promote service opportunities and make some new, interesting connections.
- **Breaking the Rules: Creativity & Sustainability at the Intersection of Art + Business (Oct. '09)**
Hosts: Pittsburgh Emerging Arts Leaders, The Rivers Club Young Executives
Led by acclaimed innovator, entrepreneur and artist Nathan Martin, CEO of Deeplocal, 70 young leaders across sectors began breaking the rules by thinking broader than their business cards in small group discussion on new approaches and risk taking.
- **Pittsburgh (G-20) Summit: Behind the Scenes (Aug. '09)**

The NPC joined a larger regional partnership to provide 300+ community members with inside info (from VisitPittsburgh & the Allegheny Conference) about how Pittsburgh would welcome the world in September 2009, what to expect and how to be great regional ambassadors.
- **Wheeling Through History South Side Bike Tour/Reception (April '09)**

A group of cyclists cruised the South Side trails while taking in their historic surroundings. Afterwards, a larger group met for food, drinks and an update on regional trail developments from Friends of the Riverfront at the OTB (Over the Bar) Bicycle Café.
